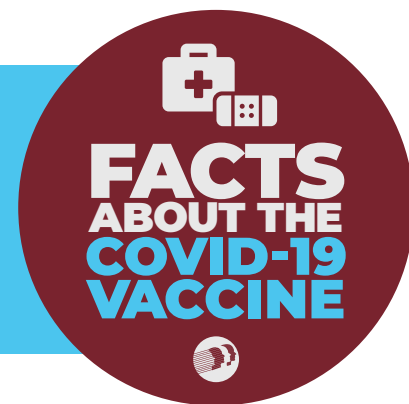


# KEY INFORMATION FOR AFTER YOUR COVID-19 VACCINE



Go to [de.gov/getmyvaccine](https://de.gov/getmyvaccine) to find a location for your second dose — but wait until your second-dose due date approaches, to make sure opportunities are available. Your second dose doesn't have to come from the same place as your first. You can find one at a pharmacy near your home, maybe from your own health care provider, or even from a state-run or coordinated vaccination event. **You should receive your second vaccine:**



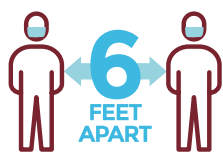
**28 days after the first dose for the Moderna vaccine.**



**21 days after the first dose for the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.**

If it is not possible to follow the recommendations above, the science is showing you can wait longer — up to 42 days.

**Continue to protect yourself** — even after both doses — and reduce the spread of COVID-19:



Maintain social distancing by keeping 6 feet or more apart.



Wear a face covering over your mouth and nose, and don't share masks.



Wash or sanitize your hands frequently.

**If you feel sick**, follow up with your primary care provider.

**Download the COVID Alert DE app to slow the spread.**



This free smartphone app protects you and your privacy. It will quickly alert you if you have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.
