Year Round Stewardship Resources

Episcopal Church Foundation (ecf.org)

The Episcopal Church Foundation is a non-profit which provides information to Episcopal Churches, but is not part of our church structure. Some of their resources include weekly ministry tips; Vital Practices on various topics; Vestry Papers; Annual Giving materials; Planned Giving materials – and many others. These materials are free for any who sign up, but they do periodically ask that users contribute. There is no set amount, so any contributions will be what you can manage.

The Episcopal Network for Stewardship (tens.org)

This organization requires a subscription, but for parishes in Delaware that subscription is paid from the Diocesan Budget. Their previous offerings were limited to Annual Giving, but they are branching out into Planned Giving, Capital Campaigns, and year round stewardship offerings. Their password changes annually, and will be found on this slide (Matthew 22:4) as well as in the Annual Giving presentation information on our Diocesan Website (Resources/Stewardship).
